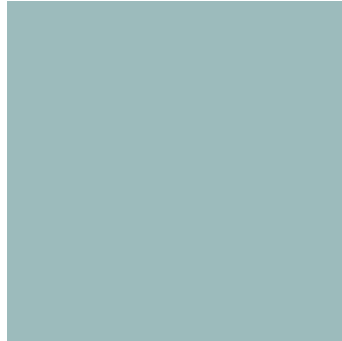
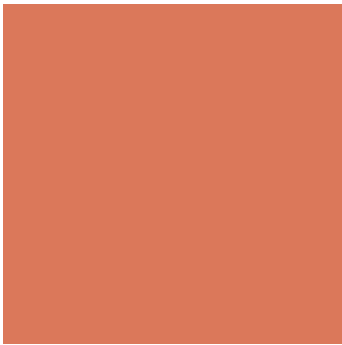

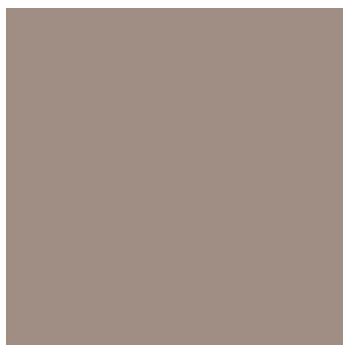

- Health/Social Services

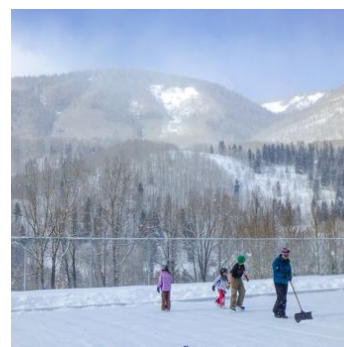


The Rico Center awards its grants once a year. The application deadline is October 1. Grant policies, application forms and more information about The Rico Center can be found on our website:

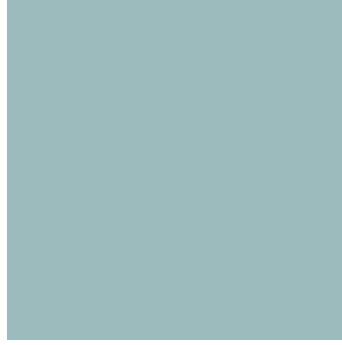
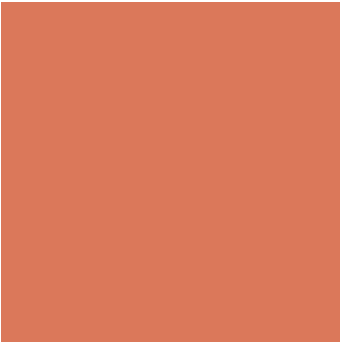

# Rico Preschool

*A true “school of choice”*

## Mission:

The Rico Preschool’s mission is to provide a developmentally appropriate program that emphasizes experiential learning and encourages social growth, academic readiness and emotional development in Rico’s young children.

## About:

While the Rico Preschool is the sole licensed childcare facility in Rico, we provide much more than daycare. Our school provides high quality preschool education in a small classroom setting at an affordable price. The opportunity to attend school locally gives Rico children the benefit of an intimate classroom environment and enables them to spend more of their time learning instead of commuting to other communities. The classroom combines self-directed activity centers (e.g.: manipulatives; art; dramatic play) with teacher-led exercises in letter recognition and phonemes that lay the foundation for reading.

In addition to the added social and academic benefit of shared activities with the Elementary school across the hall, Rico Preschool also acts as a “feeder” program (while ensuring that young students are academically prepared) to the Rico Elementary School.

Our entire school is about to embark on an “expeditionary learning” program developed with Harvard and Outward Bound. Our preschoolers will participate in much of the program. Please help our mission with your gift.

# Rico Fire Protection District

## About:

Rico Fire Department (RFP) provides fire, EMS and Search and Rescue (SAR) emergency response not only to residents of the Rico Fire Protection District, but also to those visiting the USFS lands that surround Rico, and travelers on Colorado State Highway 145 (the steep, winding, and avalanche-exposed path south of Rico and up to Lizard Head Pass.)

## History:

The RFP started in the 1880's. Formed into a special district in 1992, RFPD initiated the Ambulance Service and SAR for eastern Dolores County. RFPD has built a heated fire station, purchased a new ambulance, and obtained multiple fire apparatus. RFPD has also modernized its rescue, extrication, structural and wildland firefighting equipment. As a result, Rico's ISO rating has improved from a 9 to a 6 (ISO factors into homeowner insurance premiums).

RFPD is facing a dramatic decrease in its property tax revenues. At the same time, severe drought and the rigors of ever increasing fire and life safety standards have forced many small communities into crisis mode. While the RFPD is very strong, new equipment is required to mobilize against the now (all too real) threat of forest fire.

# Rico Historical Society

## **Mission:**

The Rico Historical Society was founded to acknowledge, conserve and promote awareness of Rico history.

## **About:**

The Rico Historical Society collects, interprets, protects and makes available to the public historical information dating back over 150 years. Our interpretive displays are located at historically protected sites such as mining head frames and the Denver & Rio Grande water tank. Our large collection of historic pieces and information is housed and displayed at the Rico Museum, opened in 2010 and visited by locals, tourists, passers-by and school groups.

The Rico Historical Society operates as a 501(c)(3), non-profit organization. We have accomplished much in our ten-year history. After establishing protection for the three previously mentioned historic sites the Society

began an inventory of the 140 mine sites and camps in the Rico area. Ten of those sites in the Newman Hill vicinity were completed prior to focusing all emphasis on building and operating the museum.

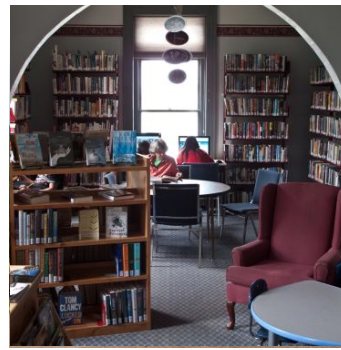
## **Request:**

# Engel House Project

## About:

The Engel House Project is an initiative to restore and protect one of the few impressive historic structures remaining in Rico. The Engel House is situated in a particularly historic area of Rico (near the Rico Community Church, the Town Hall and the Kaufman House on Silver Street which is listed on the National Historic Register). It was the home of Charles Engel an important citizen of Rico, whose photographs, writings and collections chronicle the history of Rico's mining era (featured in Dell McCoy's R.G.S. Railroad book series).

The Rico Center successfully raised over \$250,000.00, in funding from the Colorado Historical Society, The Gates Foundation and private donations to acquire the Engel House, protect it with a conservation easement and perform an architectural assessment.

The next step of this project will be preservation and rehabilitation of the structure, so that it may be opened for community service gatherings and functions.
